## May's Q & A

**Q:** How do I setup Facebook groups, such as Garage Sales?

**A:** Just login to your Facebook page and Create A Group. Not sure what the rules are for what is allowed and not allowed. You need to research that your self. For instance, pet sales because they are regulated and licensed would be an activity not allowed.

Pick a name for the group. For something that you really want to be local, like Garage Sales, you would probably want to limit the group to a small area like Crystal Lake or McHenry County. You really don't want to try to create one for the entire state of Illinois, ie Illinois Garage Sales vs McHenry Co garage sales.

Invite people to join to get the group populated.

And you need to decide the Privacy level you desire for the group.

**Public:** *The group is discoverable (anyone can search for it and receive info on the group). And anyone can see who is a member and what is posted. You don't have to be a member to access the group.*

**Closed:** *The group is discoverable and the world can see who runs it. But only members can see who is a member and what is posted.*

**Secret:** *The group is not discoverable (a search of groups won't list it). Only group members can see who is in the group or what is posted.*

You can select others to share responsibility to run the group. Admins have full power while Moderators have just a few powers. See Facebook for the differences.

Q: Sending email over VPN. Does the receiver need the same VPN?

A: The receiver would only need the VPN if the mail server was only reachable over the VPN. If the Receiver's mail server is reachable outside a VPN connection, no VPN is required to receive that email.

Q: I use Chrome for my browser and get "View my PDF" ads. How do I block them?

A: Use an addon program like Adblock.

Q: Password manager demo please?

Q: Why would streaming music from service A take more bandwidth than music from service B?

A: 2 reasons. 1) different compression algorithms, in other words different methods can provide fewer bytes to transfer. 2) different audio quality standards. The more highs and more low frequency sound provided can take more bandwidth.

Q: What is the software tool called that re-organizes the hard drive to make it faster?

A: Defrag is the generic term for doing that function. However with the new type of NTFS and solid state drives, the need for defragging a hard drive has virtually disappeared.

Open up the Windows file explorer(icon looks like a file folder). Right click on a drive letter on the left side of the screen. Select Properties. Then the Tools tab. And click on Defragmentation.
